Conceptual Design for Klepalo Border Crossing Reconstruction Presented to Stakeholders

On 27 February 2026, the Project Team in Customs Administration hosted a presentation of the conceptual design for the reconstruction of the Klepalo Border Crossing. The event brought together members of the Customs Administration's Project Team and the designers engaged in the development of the projects, as well as wider group of stakeholders' institutions.

The presentation was opened by the Project Manager, who provided an overview of the project's background and highlighted the significance of the planned reconstruction. She reflected on the long-standing existence of the border crossing facility, which had never become operational, while also outlining the broader vision and objectives of the project.

Representatives of the Design Company presented the conceptual design for the new administrative building, along with the proposed urban planning concept. The presentation was led by the Chief Architect and experts responsible for the various engineering disciplines involved in the design process, offering attendees a detailed insight into the planned modernization and future functionality of the border crossing.

The conceptual solutions which were presented are the result of extensive consultations and close coordination with all relevant institutions carried out throughout the preparation process.

Chief Architect from the designer company unveiled the conceptual design and architectural vision for the future Klepalo Border Crossing. The presentation offered a detailed look at the facilities planned within the border crossing complex, with particular focus on the main administrative building.

According to the proposed design, the ground floor of the building will be shared by the Customs Administration and the Ministry of Interior's Border Police, aiming to improve coordination and operational efficiency at the crossing point. Special attention was also given to the planned Training Centre, which will be housed within the administrative building and designed to support the professional training needs of both institutions.



In addition to the architectural concept, the audience was introduced to the technical aspects of the project, including electrical installations, water supply and sewage systems, mechanical installations, telecommunications infrastructure, and the overall traffic and transport solution.
